

Investing in Canada Infrastructure program

Highlights:

- Focus on community, culture and recreation, as well as rural and northern communities
- Funding amounts are notional, meaning that they may not be disbursed over the course of the full life of the program

Feedback on our proposal:

- Municipal support is imperative to a successful outcome for us, and a letter of support will not suffice
- \$3 Million is a recommended ceiling on our request amount
- If NCTS is the applicant, we can apply for up to 65% of funding (in the community, culture and recreation stream)

Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program - British Columbia cost-shares infrastructure investments between the governments of Canada and British Columbia, local governments and other partners.

The Canadian government will invest \$3.917 billion in B.C. infrastructure over 10 years in four key areas:

- 1. Community, Culture and Recreation Infrastructure
- 2. Rural and Northern Communities Infrastructure
- 3. Green Infrastructure
- 4. Public Transit

Infrastructure plays a key role in our vision for the future of our country. Canada and B.C. signed the <u>Integrated Bilateral Agreement for the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) in 2018.</u>

The program invests in infrastructure that

- creates economic growth
- sustains well-paying jobs
- builds inclusive communities
- supports a low-carbon, green economy





Our achievements to date show that we have traction and momentum and are meeting local interests and needs.


We have done the work to prepare for this project and fundraising campaign and are ready to move forward.
